Erasmus Mundus Contact Seminar in Bangkok, Thailand October 27-28, 2011

Registration open

On **October 27-28, 2011**, an **Erasmus Mundus contact seminar** will take place in **Bangkok, Thailand**. The seminar will present the Erasmus Mundus programme, good practice examples from ongoing Erasmus Mundus projects and discuss common issues of higher education cooperation. The seminar will gather European and Thai (in limited numbers also Vietnamese / Singaporean / Malaysian) higher education representatives. The seminar will provide the opportunity for project presentation and partner search.
